CLIENT ORIENTED SERVICE CHARTERS

There was a meeting at Home Affairs on Friday, 31 October, 2014 on how government ministries, state enterprises and parastatals and local authorities should draft their Clients Service Charters in line with a template provided by the Office of the President and Cabinet.

Facilitating the training was Mrs Munemo and Mr Gura from Highlands Training Institute. The emphasis of the training was in drafting short and precise charters drawing key service standards from Results Based Management set targets for each government department and parastatals.

The standards outlined were supposed to be outward looking rather than inward looking. This translated to service standards with notable deliverables in terms of quantity; quality; timeliness and cost. In short, the charters should have the clients in mind in delivering services.

Two documents were supposed to be done, an abridged version of the client service charter and a full version guided by the template provided. The training team also emphasised on the matter of complaints handling and feedback including clients' rights and obligation which are supposed to be handled professionally.
